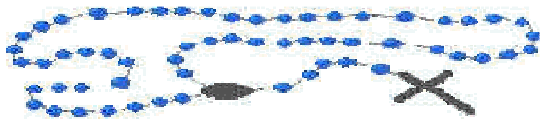

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament **First Friday July 4th 8:30 am -7:00 pm**

The holiday gives us an opportunity to spend time in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. You can sign up for a convenient time at any of the entrances to the Cathedral.

The Body and Blood of Christ present under the appearances of bread and wine are treated with the greatest reverence both during and after the celebration of the Eucharist. For example, the tabernacle in which the consecrated bread is reserved is placed "in some part of the church or oratory which is distinguished, conspicuous, beautifully decorated, and suitable for prayer". According to the tradition of the Latin Church, one should genuflect in the presence of the tabernacle containing the reserved sacrament. In the Eastern Catholic Churches, the traditional practice is to make the sign of the cross and to bow profoundly. The liturgical gestures from both traditions reflect reverence, respect, and adoration.

It is appropriate for the members of the assembly to greet each other in the gathering space of the church (that is, the vestibule or narthex), but it is not appropriate to speak in loud or boisterous tones in the body of the church (that is the nave) because of the presence of Christ in the tabernacle (USCCB, *The Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Sacrament of the Eucharist*).
